

What does the National Intelligence Team do?

The National Intelligence Team (Team Nationale Inlichtingen; TNI) acts as the point of contact for the Criminal Intelligence Team. TNI collects information on serious criminal offences and serious organised crime linked to the Netherlands. Examples of serious criminal offences are: murder, robbery, drug trafficking, child pornography, arson, terrorism, money laundering, human trafficking, corruption, and fraud, including environmental and bankruptcy fraud.

TNI makes Dutch and foreign companies and organisations aware of the fact that they can play a role in intelligence gathering, and recruits employees as police informants. In this context, intelligence gathering means collecting information about criminal offences and suspects. The police do this to develop national and international networks that help the Dutch authorities gain insight into the latest trends and developments in crimes that undermine society.
